<b>Program is offered through university or through university's Extended Education</b>	Online School of Nursing students are members of Ohio University's eCampus and are not expected to physically come to the main campus

<b>Format</b>	100% online, and we utilize Blackboard as our online learning platform.
<b>Total units required for Bachelor degree</b>	120 semester units; however, only 30 must be completed from Ohio University to confer the degree.
<b>Actual units required for nursing curriculum</b>	31 semester units. 9 Upper Level Division Courses (NRSE 4510 – NRSE 4600), which are either 3 or 4 credit units each.
<b>Maximum community college units that can be applied toward Bachelor degree</b>	90 semester units of GE and Support Courses from Community Colleges and Universities. OU will review for transfer into our program all coursework earned with a minimum 2.0 GPA in Associate and Bachelor degree programs.
<b>Can CSU GE fulfill this university's GE reqt?</b>	Very likely, in most, if not all categories. (OU is currently working on a Transfer Equivalency Guide to detail all Shasta courses that will be able to transfer equitably in lieu of taking OHIO General Education and Support Courses online.)
<b>Admission GPA</b>	2.0
<b>Student must hold active, unencumbered RN license to take coursework</b>	No. Admissions Requirements have been amended: In order to review a student's application for admission, along with a 2.0 GPA and a student's degree conferred (official transcripts), OU needs the NCLEX date/location entered into our online application. Upon admission, students may begin earning their BSN, including taking Upper Level NRSE Courses, <i>prior to sitting/passing</i> their NCLEX.
<b>Student must be employed as a licensed RN</b>	No
<b>Space available</b>	Yes
<b>Demand/impaction</b>	We are not impacted due to offering 8 start dates per year.
<b>When can a person start the program?</b>	Students may begin with OU as soon as we have received a completed application and their ADN Degree has been conferred. (OU needs all official transcripts to review a student's file for admission.)

<b>Type of term</b>	All School of Nursing NRSE Courses are held in 5-week sessions. If additional GE or Support Coursework is necessary, these courses may be offered in sessions of varying lengths from 5-15 weeks. (Many OU Colleges are working to offer their courses in accelerated sessions of 5-8 weeks.)
<b>Typical length of the program</b>	12 months – 24 months, and any length in between. It truly depends on how quickly a student chooses to progress through our program, whether they take 1, 2, or 3 courses at a time, whether they step out for one or more start dates, and their educational history, i.e. how many courses can transfer in to Ohio University.
<b>Recency requirements</b>	No expiration dates for previously completed coursework earned with a minimum 2.0 GPA.
<b>Limitations on repeated courses</b>	Students may take our NRSE courses up to 3 times each.
<b>Cost per term or per course</b>	\$243 per credit unit; pay-as-you-go per course, rather than by semester. Pay for course at least 1 week prior to the class beginning online. A 3 credit-unit course = \$729; a 4 credit unit course = \$972.
<b>Average tuition cost for entire program</b>	\$7,533 is the all-in tuition for our required 31 units of Upper Division NRSE Coursework. (There are five 3-credit unit courses & four 4-credit unit courses.)

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	<p>Additional GE or Support Courses taken with us are also offered at \$243 per credit unit.</p> <p>Students may concurrently enroll at Shasta College to complete equivalent GE and/or Support Coursework locally, rather than taking such coursework online with us, in order to further save on tuition.</p>
<b>Books/Supplies</b>	<p>For the 2018-2019 academic year, a total of 12 required textbooks for the 9 NRSE Courses. If all textbooks are purchased new, a student can expect to pay a total of \$1,034 for books.</p>
<b>Additional fees</b>	<p>Application fee is \$25.</p> <p>"Student information and Network Fee" of \$33. (This is assessed at \$3 per credit unit for less than full time enrollment.)</p> <p>Graduation Application Fee of \$50.</p>

<b>Additional Notes:</b>	<p>We do not require clinicals in our fully online RN to BSN program.</p> <p>Students can earn up to 8 units of BSN coursework prior to completing RN/ADN program at Shasta through Ohio University's Early Start program. Take Ohio RN to BSN coursework in the summers: <a href="http://www.ohio.edu/nursing-early-start">www.ohio.edu/nursing-early-start</a></p> <p>OU is working to provide a Public Health Nurse Certification pathway in our program, which should be available very soon. When we have this pathway, it will be a choice for students. Should a student choose to pursue the PHN Certification pathway, there would then be 90 clinical hours necessary to be completed locally. Clinical hours are a mandated requirement of such certification by the California Board of Registered Nursing. Upon completing the 90 clinical hours and having our BSN degree conferred, a student would then be able to apply for their CA PHN Certificate through the Board's website.</p> <p>OU is the 9<sup>th</sup> oldest public, not-for-profit university in the nation.</p>
