1. Welcome

Meeting called to order by Carolyn Borg at 3:02 PM

Carolyn demonstrated the use of ASSIST.org and how to look up Shasta College under Institutions and choose courses to see if courses are applicable for IGETC transfer to UC and/or CSU campuses. She also pointed out how to enter a specific university to see if we have an articulation agreement with that institution. It usually takes several months for approved courses to appear on the ASSIST.org website.

2. Approval of Minutes from 3-17-16

Bob Googins moved to approve 3-17-16 minutes, Lenore Frigo seconded.

The minutes were approved unanimously, with changes as noted. In Number 4 – change spelling of Wesler to Westler, last name of Mori to Sloan.

3. 2016-2017 CSU and IGETC approvals (See Attachment 1)

Carolyn showed the committee the response we received for courses submitted in December 2015 for the statewide GE articulation approval cycle. She reported that all were approved, except for CMST 10H, which was pulled. The approved courses will be available on the ASSIST.org website within a few months. It was noted that prerequisites need to be added to the ENGL 1AH and ENGL 1BH Courses.

**4. HOSP 55 Customer Service Skills for a Multicultural Workplace-
New course for Associate GE (Area 5 and 6)**

Roger Gerard attended the meeting as a guest, asking the committee to look at the newly created course HOSP 55. He made revisions to the course outline based on feedback from last month's GE meeting. He explained that the course would be co-taught by Shelly Presnell and Roger with a face to face delivery method. The instructors are planning to market this course to other areas besides CMST and HOSP. The FSA's are CMST and HOSP but it would be a course that is beneficial to many other degree areas. He wanted to determine if the committee felt this course would fall under Area 5 or 6 for G.E. Bob Googins motioned to look at this course, Lenore Frigo seconded. After discussion it was decided that this course best fits under Area 5. There was a motion to approve HOSP 55 for Shasta College G.E. pattern in Area 5B Multicultural/Living Skills. All voted in favor, and the motion carried.

5. ESCI 16 and 16L – Natural Science (Associate degree pattern)

The existing ESCI 16 course is being separated into a 2 unit lecture and 1 unit lab. This will allow Shasta College to offer this coastal oceanography course internationally or as a California coast course. There was a motion to approve ESCI 16 and ESCI 16L as two courses for our GE pattern in Natural Science. Bob Googins motioned to approve, Anita Maxwell seconded. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

6. Labs separated from lectures for CSU B3 and IGETC 5C:

The following two courses ESCI 14 L and NHIS 5 need to be approved for Shasta College GE pattern and can be submitted for the statewide GE review during the next cycle (December 16 for Spring 17) approval. We can then ask for that approval to be dated back to Summer 16.

ESCI 14L- This one unit meteorology lab will be offered as a co-requisite for ESCI 14, a 3 unit lecture course. By separating the lecture and lab content, Shasta College will be able to offer the lab portion internationally as well as in our local region.

NHIS 5L- Natural History of the Neotropics one unit lab is being separated from NHIS 5, a 3 unit lecture so the lab portion can be offered at international sites, through Operation Wallacea. This will allow students at other colleges to register for the NHIS 5 lecture on-line through Shasta College and then travel to international sites for the lab course. There was a motion to approve these for the Natural Science GE Pattern 3B. Bob Googins motioned and Anita Maxwell seconded that the committee approve both ESCI 14: and NHIS 5L for the Natural Science 3B GE pattern. All in attendance voted in favor of approving these courses and the motion carried.

7. **Other** – Carolyn shared that the committee probably would not meet in May, because all the courses have been considered that have passed the Curriculum Committee. We will be notified by email if there is a need for the May meeting.

8. Next meeting (if necessary) will be Thursday May 12, at 3:00pm in the Fireside Room.
