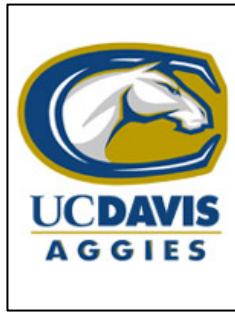

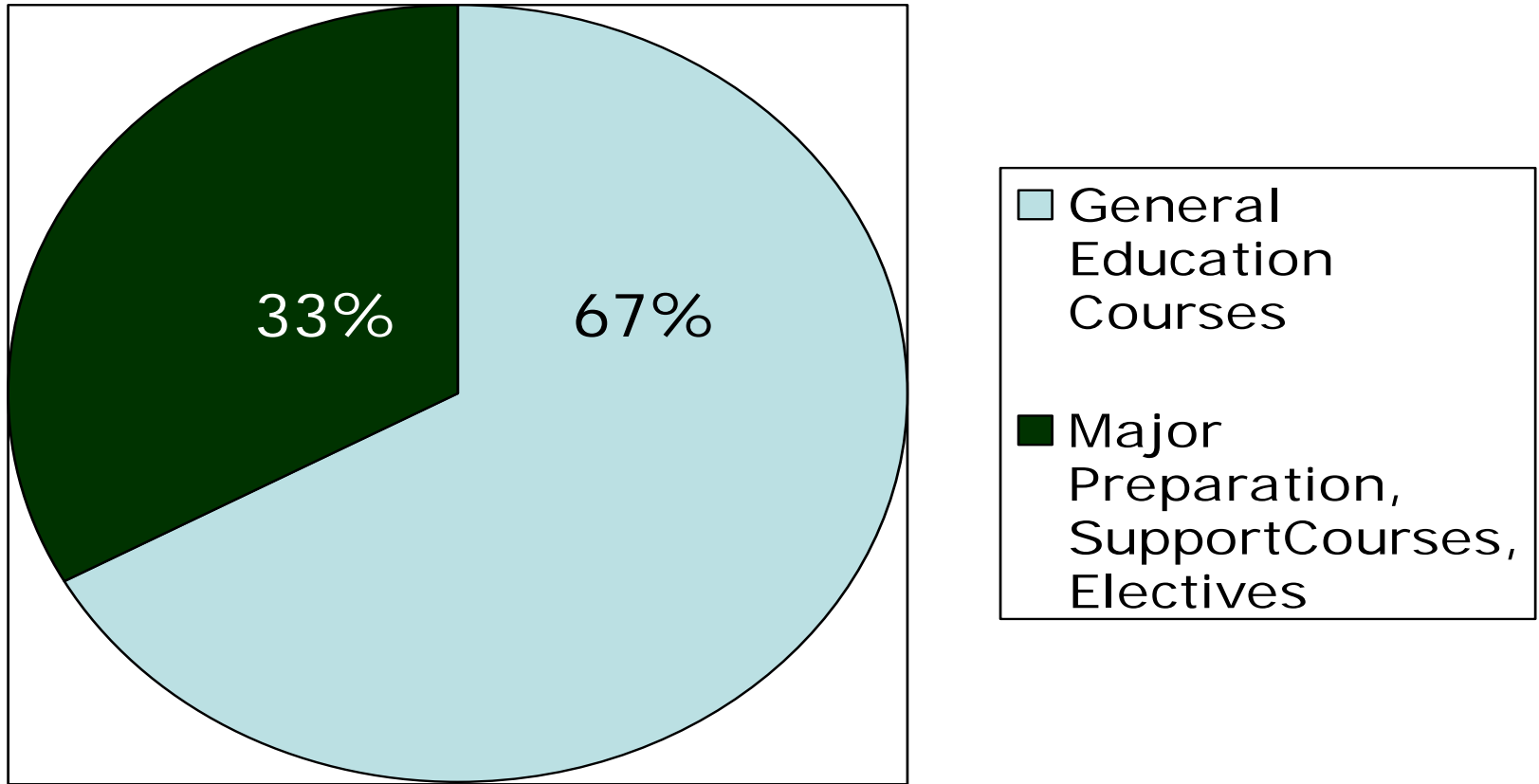

# Transfer AA

- ❑ First 60 semester units (1/2) of a BA or BS degree
- ❑ 2/3 of the units are general education
- ❑ 1/3 of the units are major courses, support courses for the major, or electives (depending on transfer institution & major)
- ❑ Major courses vary by transfer institution

# Transfer Steps

- Become a Shasta student through one of two matriculation programs (Spring of senior year in high school)
- Decide on major and transfer institution (See Counselor For Help)
- Meet with counselor to prepare educational plan (ED plan)
- Apply to transfer institution one year prior to planned transfer (Oct/Nov)

# Matriculation

Refers to the steps a student must complete in order to become a college student

# Matriculation To Shasta

1. Choose 1 of 2 matriculation plans (FFT or summer matriculation—see following slides)
2. Complete an application on line at [www.shastacollege.edu](http://www.shastacollege.edu)
3. Send your high school and college transcripts to admissions and records
4. Take the English and Math placement tests
5. Attend an orientation
6. Meet with a counselor
7. Register for classes



# A Word About Tests

- ❑ Often referred to as “assessments” and “placements”
- ❑ Students encouraged to use self-placement for math
- ❑ Test is one multiple measure used to make placement decisions
- ❑ Also use transcripts along with test scores
- ❑ AP exams of 3 or higher exempt from placement testing

# Math Self Placement

- ❑ Available at [Math Self Placement](#)
- ❑ Designed by Shasta College math faculty
- ❑ Student reads guidelines carefully
- ❑ Evaluates whether he/she can solve sample problems
- ❑ Completes placement document and returns to Assessment Center

# 2 Matriculation Programs

- FFT (freshman fast track)—registration priority based on when student attended orientation
  
- Summer registration

# Freshman Fast Track

- For any student who meets the [FFT](#) matriculation deadlines
- Transfer, vocational and certificate seeking students are eligible
- Apply, send transcripts, attend spring orientations by deadlines
- Register in May
- Make an appointment to see a counselor for education plan

# Summer Matriculation

1. Complete Assessment Tests
2. Send transcripts
3. Attend orientation in summer, meet with a counselor during orientation and register immediately after orientation (following FFT students)
4. After the semester starts you will meet with a counselor to complete an educational plan

# Education Plan (ED PLAN)

1. Counselor prepares a plan and timeline for transfer to university

## TRANSFER REQUIRES

1. General education
2. Major or major-support courses
3. 60 transferable units
4. Minimum 2.0 GPA (higher at selective schools)

# How long will YOU be at Shasta College?

- ❑ If you start with transfer level English and Math and take 15 transferable units per semester, it will take 4 semesters
- ❑ If you start with transfer level English and Math and take 12 transferable units per semester, it will take 5 semesters
- ❑ Part-time students will take longer as will students who must take remedial math and English Classes or students who change their majors

# What is a Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)?

- ❑ Most of the University of California campuses have TAGs
- ❑ The student must meet minimum requirements to apply for a TAG
- ❑ If the student's TAG is accepted, the UC will indicate additional requirements
- ❑ If all requirements are met, the student knows in advance that he/she will be accepted to that campus
- ❑ UCLA and UCB do not offer TAGs

# Applying To Transfer Institutions

- ❑ Priority application to CSU is Oct thru Nov **one year prior** to transfer ([www.csumentor.edu](http://www.csumentor.edu))
- ❑ Priority application to UC is November **one year prior** to transfer ([www.universityofcalifornia.edu](http://www.universityofcalifornia.edu))
- ❑ Mid-year, private or out of state transfer application timelines vary

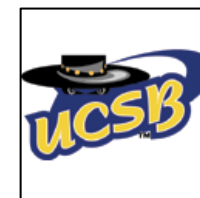
